

A word from our spiritual director, Father Sam

I hope all of you had a very relaxing and enjoyable summer. As for me, by God's grace, I was able to attend a retreat for priests in Poland at the end of June. The retreat was hosted by an international movement of priests started by Blessed Mother Teresa of Calcutta called the Corpus Christi Movement. The retreat took place at a seminary in the city of Czestochowa a short distance from the shrine where the famous icon of the Blessed Mother holding the infant Jesus under the title of "Our Lady of Czestochowa," also known as "the Black Madonna," is venerated by thousands of pilgrims every year.

This icon has an intriguing and mysterious history. The icon's creation is attributed to the evangelist St. Luke who supposedly painted it on a cypress table top from the house of the Holy Family. According to a source I found on the Internet, the Black Madonna is credited with miraculously saving the monastery of Jasna Góra (translated into English: Bright Mount) from a 17th century Swedish invasion which changed the course of the war. This event led the king to "crown" Our Lady of Czestochowa as Queen and Protector of Poland in the year 1656. Another legend concerning the icon is that the presence of the holy painting saved its church from being destroyed in a fire, but not before the flames darkened the flesh tone pigments. There is also a legend regarding the two scars on the Black Madonna's right cheek. In the year 1430, the Hussites stormed the monastery and stole the icon. After putting it in their wagon, the Hussites tried to get away but their horses refused to move. They threw the portrait down to the ground and one of the plunderers drew his sword upon the image and inflicted two deep strikes. When the robber tried to inflict a third strike, he fell to the ground and squirmed in agony until his death. Because of the Black Madonna, Czestochowa is regarded as the most popular shrine in Poland, with many Polish Catholics and many others making a pilgrimage there every year. Before he became pope, and even after, John Paul II visited the shrine several times

In addition to the retreat, I also had an opportunity to spend time with my mother, sister, brother and their spouses and children. We stayed one week at a beautiful house on a lake in North Carolina near the Smokey Mountain range. I had a great time swimming, boating, and hiking. But now that the summer is coming to an end, it is time to return to our labor of love in the Lord's vineyard. As for our Catholic Professional and Business Club, I am very excited about the variety and caliber of speakers we have scheduled for the upcoming year. The topics will be very timely and supremely relevant. I pray our time together will help strengthen our faith. This will be a great year for focusing on our continuing formation in our Catholic Faith. In fact, Pope Benedict declared this year, starting in October, as a time for the entire Church time to seriously reflect on the gift of her Faith. I encourage all of you to invite a business associate, family member, neighbor, or friend to attend our monthly breakfasts to hear our lineup of great speakers.

Finally, I would like to let all of you know that St. Stanislaus is hosting a free youth concert on September 8th at 8pm on the lawn in front of the 1200 Maze blvd church. The theme of the concert is taken from the Gospel of Matthew verse 17:20. Jesus tells us that if we only had the faith the size of a mustard seed, we would be able move mountains. Jesus reminds us that the power of faith in Him can overcome any and all difficulties, hardships, challenges or struggles we all face, especially the youth in today's secular culture. We have 4 performances, including praise and worship of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, which we hope will inspire the young people of our community and help strengthen their Catholic faith.
